## Man Released After Killing Brother-in-law

Indianapolis, Ind., April 22.—(United Press)—Edgar Leidecker, who shot and killed his brother-in-law, Arthur Wright, late Tuesday, is free today on his own recognizance on orders of Coroner Robinson, while police probe events surrounding the shooting.

Leidecker shot Wright and fatally wounded him after the latter had wounded his wife, following an argument in front of her home. Wright, an ex-convict, had been trying to force his wife to a reconciliation, and, failing in this, had planned to kill her and commit suicide, according to a note found on his person.

After shooting Wright, Leidecker called police who rushed to the scene and found him awaiting them. He made no effort to escape and, after having made a statement to police headquarters, he was released. A charge of murder had been placed against him.

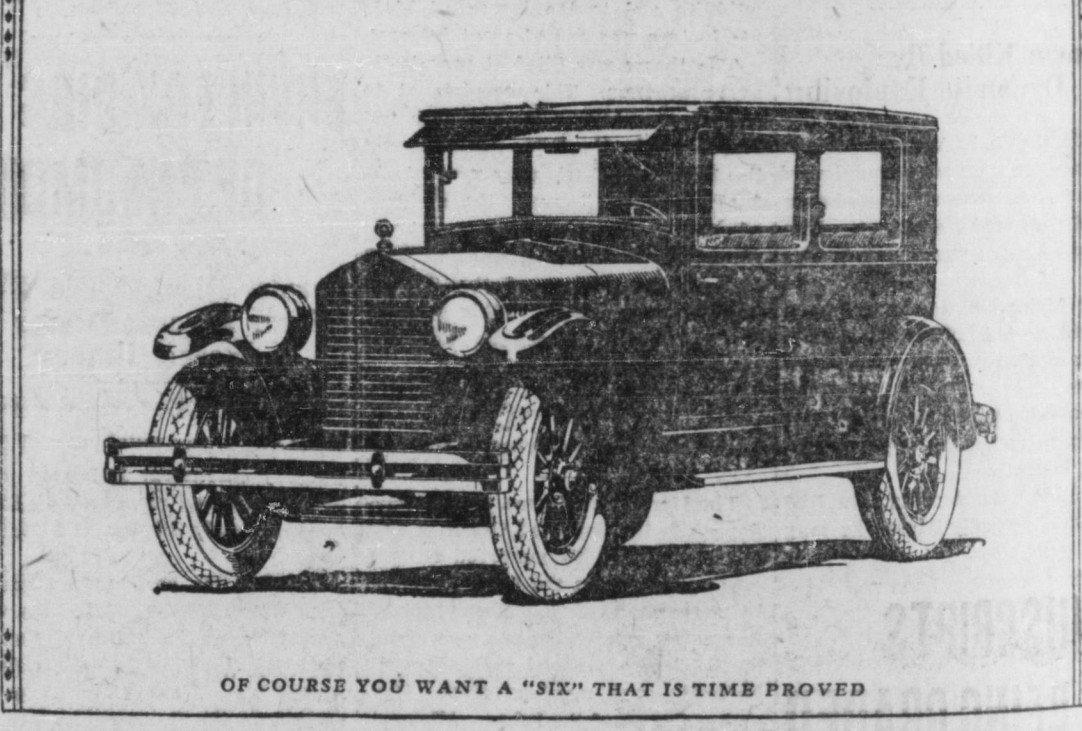
