## Illinois Motor Buses Show Rapid Increase

Springfield, Ill., July 1.—(United Press)—Within twelve years eighty-eight motor bus companies have developed a motor bus system in Illinois with 800 busses, covering more than two thousand miles of hard road, it is announced by the Illinois Commerce Commission.

First certificates for motor bus companies were issued in 1914, and up to January 1, 1922, eighteen certificates had been issued. The number issued up to January 1, 1926, was 192. Six of these certificates were for freight lines, the remainder being for passenger busses.
