Atlantic City, N. J., July 2.—(United Press.)—Willis Harper, chunky 11-year-old, from Beaver, Ky., today became the national champion by defeating the solemn Dan Gore of Springfield, Mass., in five out of six games.

Willis, a smiling youngster in a fresh, well starched blouse, gray knickers and pepper and salt stockings, took the victory as a matter of course. He was much less nervous than his scowling opponent and performed more sensationally than at any time during the five-day tournament.

Special Judge Named For Trial In City Court

I. U. To Sell Land To State For Site For New Office Building

Indianapolis, Ind., July 2.—(United Press.)—Trustees of Indiana University were prepared today to make immediate transfer to the state of the land on which the old university school of medicine stands.

The ground is sought by Governor Jackson for the construction of an office building for state departments which are cramped in their present quarters in the statehouse.

The university trustees asked \$100,000 for the land and building, the money to be used in constructing an addition to the new school of medicine.

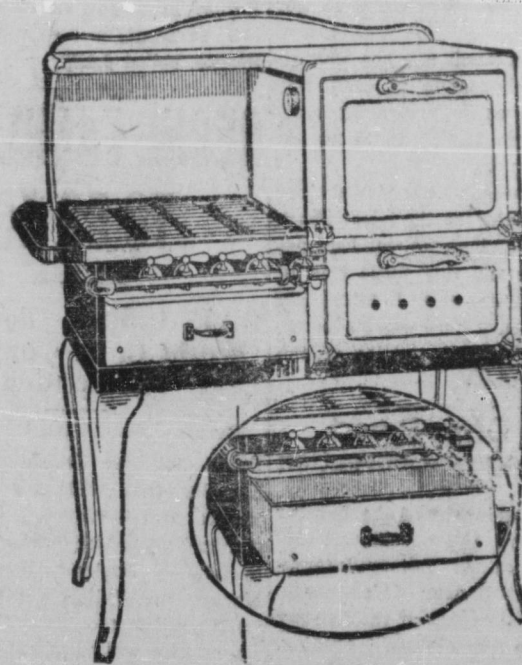
