sheathed. A few quick turns of a rope and the condemned man was securely fastened to the garrote, his neck was fixed within the steel and Romero began to turn the screw.

Two complete turns were required before sufficient pressure could be obtained and then Aguilera struggled in the grip of death for 11 minutes.

A daughter of the murdered woman sent Aguilera to the death machine. At the trial she related that her cousin came to her home on the morning of August 24, 1924, and demanded a cup of coffee from his aunt.

The aged woman went to the kitchen to prepare the drink, and while she puttered there Aguilera approached her, struck her a blow with a club and then proceeded to beat her until her life became extinct.

The daughter was instructed to tell the authorities that an unidentified negro had committed the crime. Aguilera took \$200 belonging to his aunt and left the house. He was captured, tried and convicted.

Howard is inquiring into reports from Cedar Lake, Indiana, and Danville, Ills., that a caravan of taxicabs belonging to the insolvent company went through the towns, Sunday, bound for Indianapolis. Howard said he had thus far failed to discover anything in the Company's records which showed that any of the 700 cabs were missing.
