#### Forty-nine Florida And Georgia Banks Fail

Atlanta, Ga., July 15.—(United Press.)—Failure of 49 Florida and Georgia banks since Monday was confirmed today by the Georgia state banking department.

Forty eight of the banks closed their doors after the bankers trust company of Atlanta failed. They were small banks of which the Atlanta institution was the chief source of funds.

T. R. Bennett, state superintendent of banking, denied that the whole sale failures reflected a serious financial situation in Georgia and Florida.

#### Meat Prices In America Are Being Investigated

Washington, July 15.—(United Press.)—A preliminary investigation is under way to determine whether meat prices are being increased in this country to enable American packers to undersell their British rivals abroad, it was learned today.

The packers and stock yards administration of the department of agriculture has taken cognizance of charges by British packers that American consumers are paying the expenses of the international price war.

#### Forest Fires Spreading

Winnipeg, Man., July 15.—(United Press.)—Roaring forest fires, spreading through heavily timbered districts in British Columbia and Alberta, were still blazing today. The flames had taken four lives, destroyed timber of an immense value, halted logging operations in the coast province and were menacing isolated settlements.

Large forces of forest rangers and volunteers were battling to bring the fires under control.

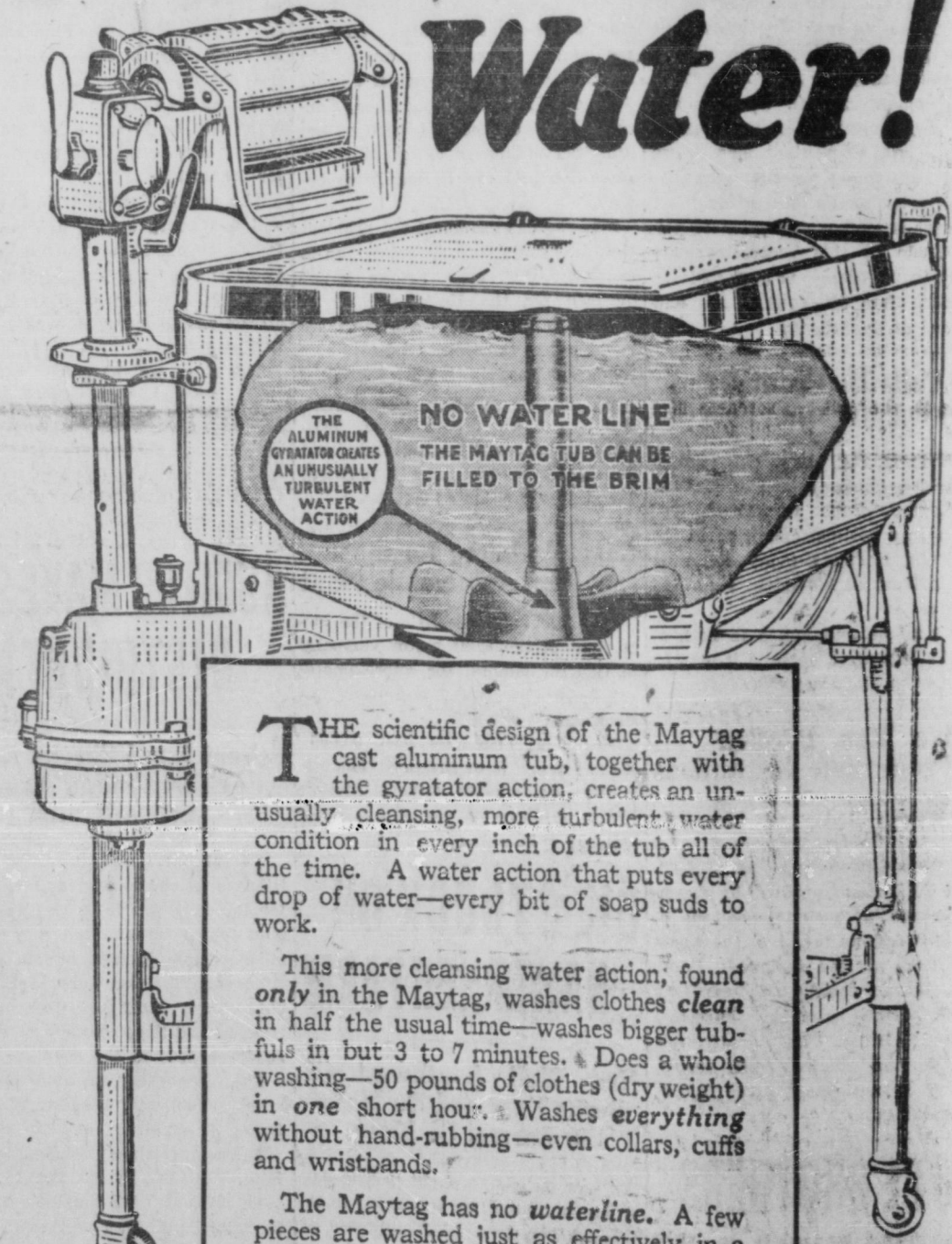
