Dry, Hot Weather Is Hard On Mosquitos

Indianapolis, Ind., July 28.—(United Press)—The state board of health today announced that the mosquitoes which are now breeding in the state are a danger to the health of the people.

Advantages, according to Wallace state entomologist.

During a recent wet spell, a plague of mosquitos stormed Indiana, choosing the lake districts as their favorite feeding ground.

Vacationists raised a howl which could be heard throughout the state but didn't know where the insects originated.

It is hard for mosquitos to breed and multiply during dry, hot weather. Wallace stated, but a short rainy spell with resultant cooler temperatures, will produce the stinging pests by the millions.

The insects are born in rain barrels and cave troughs and when a trough is clogged for a short time a plague is sure to come.

Indianapolis, Ind., July 28.—(United Press)—Music will have its reward as well as its pleasure at the Indiana state fair this year, according to an announcement made today by the State board of agriculture.

Prizes totaling \$750 will be offered by the board to the high school bands winning the regional and state contests at the opening day of the 1926 fair, Saturday, Sept. 4, according to the announcement.

The state has been divided into three regions for the purpose of conducting semi-final contests.

The first region will include all counties north of and including Jay, Blackford, Grant, Howard, Carroll, Tippecanoe, and Warren.

Region two will include all counties between the region one line and a southern boundary line including Union, Fayette, Rush, Shelby, Johnson, Morgan, Owen, Clay and Vigo. The third region will include all other counties in the southern part of the state.

Prizes of \$75, \$50 and \$25 will be awarded to the first three bands in each region while the three winners will compete at the State fair for the state band championship.

Prizes for the three winners in the State finals will be \$150, \$100 and \$50.

Rules for the contest state that all band members must be bona fide members of the schools they represent although grammar and junior high students are permitted to play with a high school band.
