The government introduced into the chamber of deputies project to permit operations preliminary to stabilization.

In presenting the project to the chamber, Poincare confirmed the belief that the government intends to stabilize the franc only after its value has risen from the present level.

nominating for governor, today was leading the field by nearly 10,000 votes. His nearest opponent was W. W. Barnell, farmer, who made a spectacular state-wide campaign without funds other than small amounts supporters dropped in his hat.

Democratic Action On Registration Law In Doubt

Indianapolis, Ind., Aug. 4.—The use of the army and navy with instructions to shoot to kill if necessary to enforce the prohibition laws was recommended to day by Dr. E. S. Shumaker, superintendent of the Indiana anti saloon league.

Shumaker outlined his plan for tight enforcement of the dry laws in a letter to secretary Nicholson, of the Philadelphia law enforcement league.

Nicholson asked 165 dry leaders to work out plans for reenforcement and to make a united demand on the government that it be accomplished.

Shumaker urged drastic steps against judges who are lenient with violators and condemned wholesale releases thru the parole system.
