The New Traffic Ordinance

TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR THE CITY OF DECATUR

Passed by the City Council, August 17, 1926 Decatur, Indiana, An Ordinance for the Regulation of Traffic within the City of Decatur, Indiana and Providing Penalties.

wheels of said vehicle shall be not farther than twelve (12) inches from the said curb, except as herein otherwise provided.

(s) No vehicles shall stop or park within ten (10) feet of any fire plug.

(t) No vehicle shall park or stand within any part of such alley in the congested district except while engaged in the loading or unloading of the same.

(u) No vehicle shall pass another vehicle going in the same direction at any railway crossing, or at any street intersection, and no vehicle shall be driven in any manner so as to interfere with the safety of any flagman at any railway crossing.

(v) It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or corporation to permit any stone, dirt or other material to drop from any vehicle driven upon the streets, alleys, avenues, boulevards, park roads and public places in said city.

(w) It shall be unlawful for children to use the roadway of any street as a play-ground.

SECTION 4.

That the owners, operators, drivers and persons in charge of any vehicle as hereinafter described, hereinafter referred to as "operators", shall conform to and observe the following rules and regulations upon the streets, alleys, avenues, boulevards, park roads and public places in said city.

(x) The term "Vehicle" shall mean and include anything used for transportation of persons or things upon and along the streets, alleys or public places whether propelled by human or animal or explosive power or electric, or steam or other power, except street cars or other vehicles running on fixed tracks, and baby carriages.

The term "Horses" shall mean and include all domestic animals.

The term "Operator" shall mean and include the driver or rider of any vehicle as defined herein.

The term "Street" shall mean and include any road, street, avenue, alley, parkway or public places within the City.

The term "Parking" shall be deemed to mean the placing, allowing or permitting or stopping of any vehicles within any street or public place for any purpose other than the loading or unloading of freight, goods, wares or merchandise, providing that such loading or unloading of passengers shall not exceed three (3) minutes, and such loading or unloading of freight, goods, wares, or merchandise shall not exceed fifteen (15) minutes.

The term "Congested district" within the meaning of this ordinance shall constitute all that part of the City of Decatur included within the territory bounded by Marshall Street on the north, Adams Street on the South, Fourth Street on the west and the St. Marys River on the east.

(y) Vehicles shall be driven on that part of the roadway to the right of the center.

(z) A vehicle meeting another vehicle shall pass to the right.

(aa) Every driver shall turn to the right of the street when signalled from vehicle behind desiring to pass.

(bb) A vehicle overtaking another shall pass on the left side of the overtaken vehicle and shall not pull over to the right until entirely cleared of such overtaken vehicle.

(cc) Slow moving and heavily laden vehicles shall keep close to right hand curbs, allowing more swiftly-moving vehicles free passage to their left.

(dd) No vehicle shall back in any street by so doing it interferes with vehicles.

(ee) A vehicle turning into another street to the right shall turn as near to the right of center of the street intersection.

(ff) It shall be unlawful for any driver of any automobile or other vehicle to make a "U" turn in and upon Second Street between Marshall and Adams Streets in said City.

(gg) It shall be unlawful for any driver to turn his vehicle to the left of any "Stop and Go" signal, or any other traffic signal at any street intersection.

(hh) It shall be unlawful for any driver to run into or against or for any person to remove, replace or change the location of or mutilate, deface or destroy, any traffic regulation light, sign post, or standard upon any street.

(ii) Any vehicle waiting at the curb shall promptly give place to a vehicle about to load or unload goods or merchandise, provided that said loading or unloading cannot be accomplished at any other entrance to said place of business.

(jj) A vehicle shall back up to a curb only long enough to be loaded or unloaded; horses attached to four-wheeled vehicles back up to the curb and the shafts or poles or unhitched vehicles backed up to the curb must be turned parallel to the curb in the direction of traffic.

(kk) No vehicle shall emerge into any street from a stable, garage, or alley at a rate of speed faster than four and one half miles per hour, and all such vehicles must give warning of their approach.

(ll) No vehicle shall occupy any part of any street in such manner as to interfere with or interrupt the passage of other vehicles except where it is being loaded or unloaded, and then only for such times as may be reasonably necessary for such loading or unloading, and any persons, firm or corporation desiring to block traffic by loading or unloading any material safe or other things shall first receive permission from the Chief of Police.

(mm) All vehicles and interurban cars stopping at crossings shall stop back of a point parallel with the property line of the intersecting street to its right.

(nn) All vehicles shall come to a complete stop at all railway and interurban crossings before crossing the same, except where there is a "Stop and Go" sign, a crossing gate, a watchman or a traffic officer.

(oo) Vehicles shall stop only upon the right hand side of any street with in such city parallel with the curb thereof in such manner that the right

tur, Indiana while the said traffic sign is showing an orange or red light towards the intersection upon which said person, firm or corporation is approaching said traffic sign, but said person so operating said automobile or other vehicle shall bring said vehicle to a stop before coming up to said street intersection and so remain as long as either said orange or red light is so showing.

SECTION 10.

It shall be the duty of all owners of vehicles to remove them from streets which are by police order directed to be cleared at a certain hour for any special occasion. Any vehicle which is not so removed by the owner or person in charge thereof before the hour designated for the street to be cleared may be removed by the police to a convenient parking place and said removal shall be done at the risk of the owner.

SECTION 11.

Traffic upon the streets shall be under the control of the Board of Public Safety, and all drivers and pedestrians must at all times comply with any direction given by voice, hand or other means by any member of the police or fire force as to stopping, starting, approaching or departing from any place, the manner of taking up and setting down passengers and loading and unloading goods.

SECTION 12.

All pedestrians crossing streets in the congested district shall cross at right angles and shall not cross diagonally at such intersection. Pedestrians shall pass to the right in passing others from an opposite direction and to the left in overtaking others, except in cases of emergency pedestrians shall use only the side walks and crosswalks and not cross the street except at regular crossings and at right angles.

SECTION 13.

No vehicle shall pass another in or upon any street or public place unless such vehicles are operated at a distance of less than 18 feet apart. If such vehicle is being towed at any time between one half hour after sunset and one half hour before sunrise such vehicle being towed shall maintain lights on both sides and the rear, visible in the rear and on both sides for a distance of not less than 200 feet.

SECTION 14.

It shall be unlawful for the owner or custodian of any motor vehicle or motor bicycle to permit the same to be driven by any person under 16 years of age.

SECTION 15.

It shall be unlawful for anyone to ride upon or being upon any vehicle in such manner that his body, or any part of it shall protrude beyond the limits of the vehicle.

SECTION 16.

No person shall ride any bicycile, or motorcycle, or use any mercantile push cart upon the paved or gravelled sidewalks or public places intended exclusively for pedestrians. No person shall ride a bicycile upon the sidewalks in said city, and no person shall carry a child under five years of age upon any bicycile or motorcycle, provided however that this section shall not apply to side cars.

SECTION 17.

It shall be unlawful to have any person park any automobile or other vehicle on any street in the congested district without first obtaining a permit from the Board of Public Safety.
