Bluffton Boy Is Shot In Arm While Hunting

Bluffton, Aug. 20.—Dale Prough, son of John Prough, of this city, was accidentally shot through the right arm Thursday morning, while hunting squirrels in the woods on the John Oswalt farm, four miles east of this city. Robert Brown and Joseph Em-schwiler had gone hunting with Prough. The boys were sitting on a fence and the .22 calibre rifle carried by Prough was leaning against the fence when it was discharged in some unknown manner. The bullet struck the Prough lad in the right arm just below the elbow and passed through the arm between the two bones, coming out on the other side about four inches from where it had entered.
