New Orleans, La., Aug. 26.—(United Press)—As a tropical hurricane

which struck the Gulf coast last night blew itself out in sparsely settled interior sections today a check of the gale swept area showed property damage estimated at \$350,000 and a known death toll of 2.

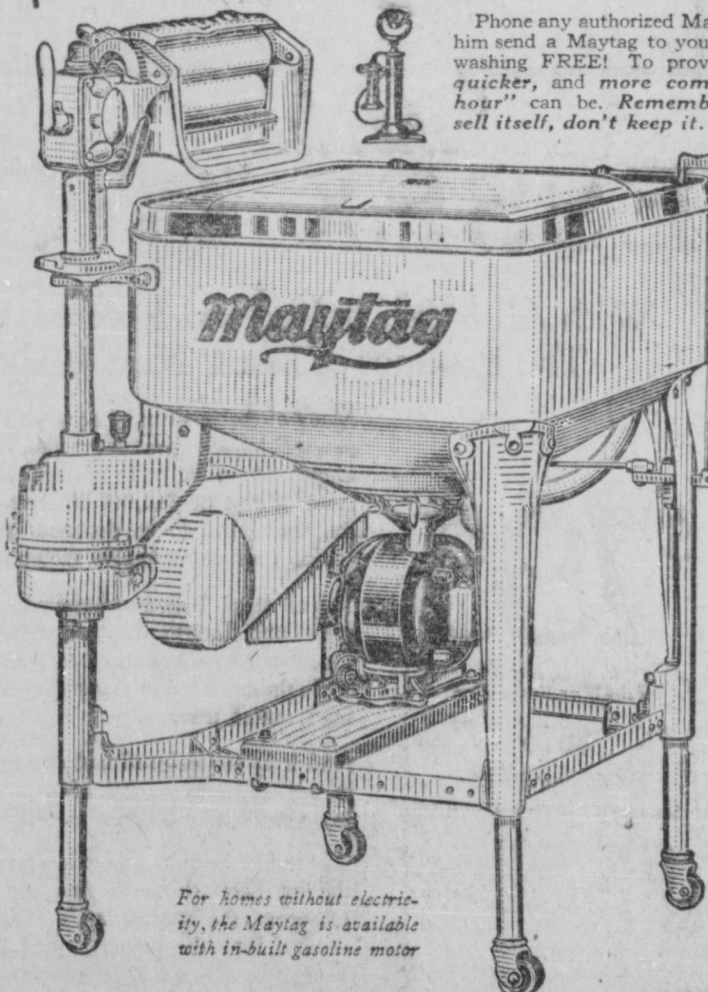
