George "Ukelele" Uhle won his 21st game of the season for the Cleveland Indians. He shut the Yanks out, 6-0.

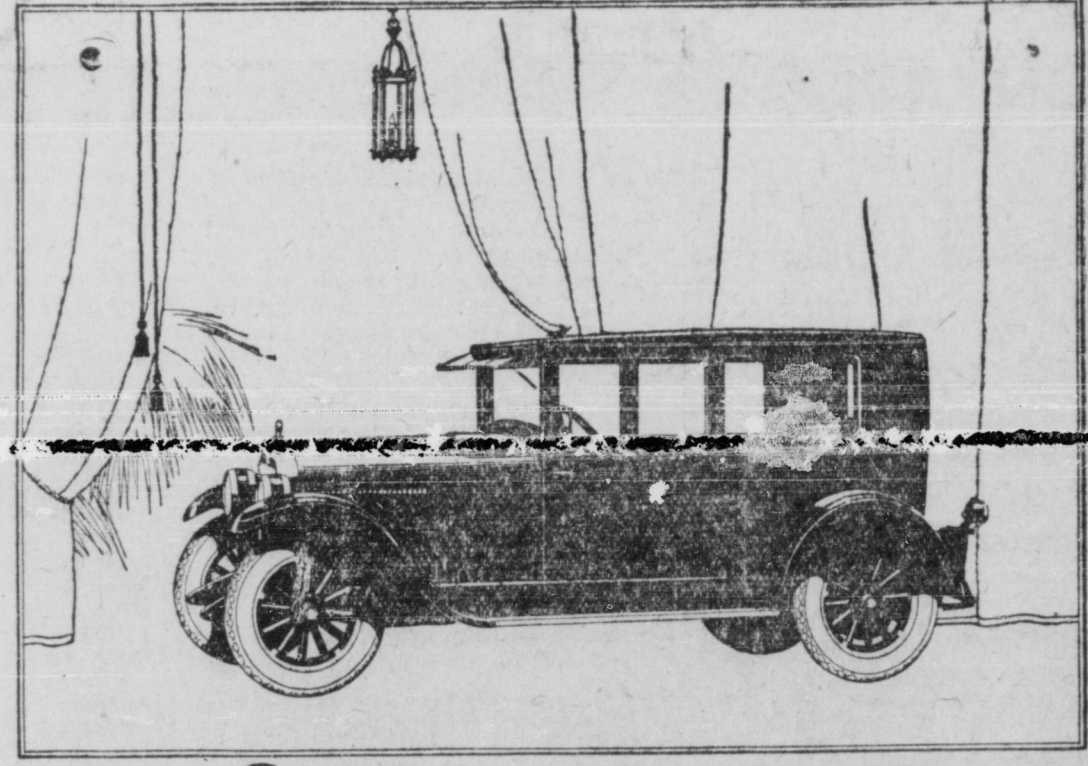
