Lafayette, Ind. Sept. 2.—(United Press)—The work of Purdue university reaches to every corner of the globe, it is indicated by requests for university publications and for information on subjects related to engineering and agriculture.

Sapporo, Japan, (United Press)—Great excitement has been aroused here by alleged cruelty on the part of orators who, insisting that 9,000 pupils stand in a blazing sun for several hours while they spoke at inauguration ceremonies of the Sapporo Branch of the Japan Red Cross Society, caused the collapse of more than 200 of the children who subsequently required medical aid.

Total value of display fireworks produced in the United States last year was \$6,031,435, an increase of more than 21 per cent over the 1923 figure.
