place for they can rest at ease with
the thought that the chances of
drowning in the pool are not as likely
as in a sand pit or river. For this
reason provision should be made to
secure permits for the boys and girls
who wish to learn to swim.

The county councilmen, commis-
sioners, town and city councils, town-
ship advisory boards and school
boards will meet next week and fix
the tax rates in their respective tax-
ing units. Budgets and estimated tax
rates to cover governmental operation
and expenses have been published
and the proper officials will decide
next week what the tax rates, collect-
able in 1927 will be. In most cases

there has been a tendency to lower
the rates in this county, the budgets
calling for only the necessary amounts
to pay regular running expenses, re-
deem bonds and pay interest and
keep up bridge and road repairs. The
financial affairs in this county are be-
ing well managed and the tax rates
effective here are lower than in most
cities of the same size. After all the
officials who fix the tax rates are
only doing it for you and are paying
for the improvements which you de-
mand.
