Chicago, Sept. 13.—(United Press.)

A lower trend was perceptible in wheat and corn prices in this morning's opening on the Chicago board of trade. Oats, however, was firm, as were provisions.

Wheat ranged 1-4 to 7-8c lower than Saturday's close.

Corn ranged from unchanged to 3-8c lower on the opening, and eased off a bit more within the next few minutes.

Oats went to an opening ranging from unchanged to 3-8c higher on the momentum of Saturday's bulge.

Provisions opened slightly higher.
