OPENING GRAIN REVIEW

Chicago, Sept. 18.—(United Press)

—With the improved Canadian weather the growing moving from that section dominating the wheat pit that grain opened 3-8 cents lower in all positions on the Chicago board of trade today. The other pits felt its influence and values sagged despite bullish news.

Corn prices were one-half to 5-8 lower in sympathy with wheat.

Oats ranged from unchanged to 1-8 cents lower than the previous close. Provisions opened lower.
