that it could not reach a mark any higher than in 1923, today were forced to close their doors.

A new levee break has curtailed service on the lone railroad line that afforded transportation to the outside country.

The crest of the flood is not expected until late today or Friday. Reports reaching here from other central Illinois points in the flooded area said that Peoria, Vandalia, and Mount Carmel are fighting losing battles against the water.

At Peoria the levees are expected to hold, but already basements in the factory district along the river are flooded. Most of the main highways leading out of that city are inundated. Vandalia is on high ground and thus not endangered by the waters but the lowlands around the city are practically covered and some 15,000 acres of crops are ruined.

A new rise in the Wabash river at Mount Carmel has destroyed all low-land crops.

Butler's backfield showed weakness in practice which is worrying Hinkle and his crew. "Red" Fromuth, quarter who was looked upon as a hope of the season, lacked the necessary drive in the workouts held the first of the week.

Bloomington, Ind., Oct. 7.—Decatur Boy Scouts have been extended an invitation by Coach Pat Page and Indiana University to be guests of the university Saturday afternoon when Indiana and Kentucky clash in the first out-of-state game of the season in Memorial Stadium. All that is necessary for the scouts to get ad-

mission is that they have their uniforms on and enter from the Tenth street gate.

A large section of the north stands has been reserved for the "young soldiers." The Indiana ninety-six piece band will play special pieces for the scouts while a yell leader will be turned over to them for cheering purposes.

Hoosier football fans are interested in the work of Pat Page and his ambition to put Indiana University on the map with other large schools for its size. The 6,000 who saw his eleven easily defeat DePauw here last Saturday went away convinced that the Crimson would show something before the final curtain falls.

## Winners Players In World's Series To Get \$6,254, Each

New York, Oct. 7.—(United Press.)—Each player on the winning team of the present Yankees-Cardinals world's series battle, will receive approximately \$2,000 more than if on the losing team.

The players' share in the series has

totalled \$372,300 of which all but 30 per cent goes to series teams. The 30 per cent is divided among other first division teams in the two leagues.

Each winning player will receive approximately \$6,254; each losing player \$4,168.

## Court No Divorce Mill Says Milwaukee Judge

Milwaukee, Wis. (United Press).—Judges of cities near Milwaukee have started war against Milwaukeeans who attempt to make their courts a second "Reno."

Judge David D. Agnew of Waukesha severely rebukes the practice of Milwaukeeans obtaining divorces outside Milwaukee county and has announced that in the future only cases from his home county will be tried in his court. "Unless an affidavit is presented showing it is for the convenience of witnesses, we are refusing to hear Milwaukee divorce cases here," Municipal Judge E. R. Burgees of Racine, who has joined Judge Agnew's movement said.

Up until a year ago, the Racine and

Kenosha courts are said to have served as a "regular divorce mill" for Milwaukee couples.

"Divorce cases should be heard in the county in which the litigants live," Judge Burgees stated. "The merits of the case can always be ascertained better by the judge in the home county where the attorneys are able to make a thorough and first hand investigation. Nearly always there are ulterior motives in going out of the county in which they live to seek divorce."
