The mayor said the letter in which he was purported to have promised to let Stephenson dictate appointments if Stephenson would support him in the race for mayor of Indianapolis was a falsehood.

Duval offered a reward of \$500 to anyone who could produce the original copy of the purported contract promising to let Stephenson dole out city patronage.

The letter in Duval's handwriting which Duval said he wrote read:

"D. C. Stephenson.
Dear Steve:

I was talking with your friend just now in regard to Ed Ramsey getting off the ticket. If it is done I will be a candidate for treasurer and go down the line with you and the boys and will do all I can for the success of our ticket this fall.

With best regards I am as ever, yours truly,

J. L. DUVAL.

The letter was written hastily on the stationary of a bank of which Duval was chairman of the board of directors. Duval said it was written about two years ago, before he considered making the race for mayor.

In denying that he wrote a contract promising to let Stephenson make certain city appointments, Mayor Duval said the signature looked like a rubber stamp. The body of the alleged contract was typewritten.

SELECT SEED CORN IS TIP

Purdue Advises Indiana Farmers To Pick Seed As Soon As Possible

Farmers in all parts of Indiana are facing an unparalleled situation in the problem of selecting seed corn for next year's crop as a result of the unusual weather conditions that have prevailed for the past sixty days which, because of heavy rains and mud, have kept farmers out of their fields. Only a small part of the 700,000 bushels of seed necessary to plant the 1927 corn crop has been gathered so far, according to information obtained by the Soils and Crops Extension Department of Purdue University. Data from the weather bureau show

that the average date of killing frost is now at hand for Northern Indiana and not more than two weeks away for Southern Indiana. Killing frosts have already occurred in Iowa where temperatures as low as 28 degrees have been recorded. Considerable injury has been done to the seed corn in that state according to the Iowa Experiment Station. The situation is all the more serious in Indiana as a result of flood damage in the low lands and river bottoms where thousands of acres of corn have been entirely ruined. These farmers must depend upon the farmers on the higher lands for next year's seed supply. All over the weather is very unfavorable to drying corn in the field which makes it especially urgent that farmers safeguard next year's corn crop by selecting their seed from the standing stalks as soon as the condition of the field will permit of such work. The need of field selection is also emphasized by the results of community and individual seed corn testing the past two years, which show that the only dependable source of seed corn is that from field frosts gives the farmer a chance to select seed.

Selecting seed corn before killing frosts give the farmer chance to pick ears from healthy vigorous stalks which are free from disease. Such seed will produce higher yields than crib selected corn if stored under favorable conditions. As soon as the seed corn is picked it should be stored in dry sheds or buildings where there is a good circulation of air. The ears should be hung by the husks or placed on horse-

made or commercial racks so that the ears do not touch. If the ears are piled together even for a few days, there is danger of molding or heating on account of the high moisture content of the corn. A dry, well ventilated basement is preferred for home storage by many corn growers and should be more generally used where available. Where corn is stored in outside sheds quick drying is necessary to avoid early freezing temperatures. This may be facilitated by opening the doors and windows and by keeping the ears from touching. This year the damp and rainy weather makes it especially necessary to make special provision for drying seed corn to prevent moulding. In many cases it may be necessary to resort to artificial heat. In such cases good ventilation is most important. In most cases, however, there is a sufficient amount of mature corn which, if selected at once and stored in well ventilated places, will soon be dry enough to escape either moulding or injury from frost.

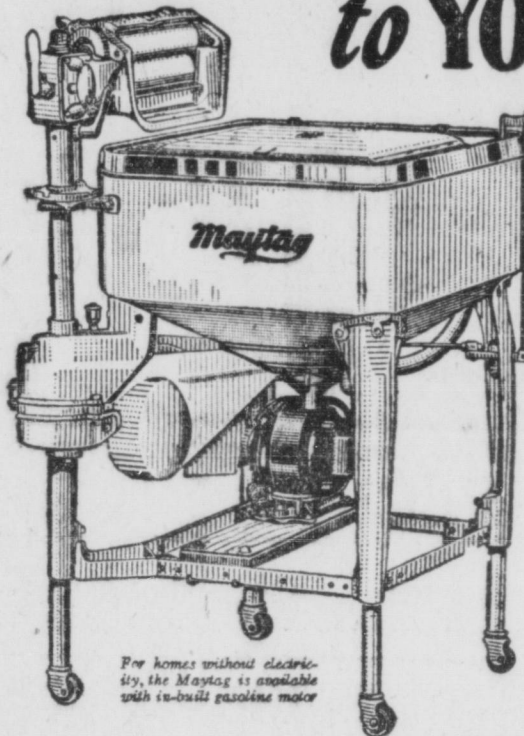
