shall during the period between the general election in the year 1926 and the convening of the legislature in 1929, and every sixth year thereafter caused to be ascertained the number of votes cast for all the candidates for secretary of state in the different counties and the last preceding general election.
"Section 5—The number of senators and representatives shall at the session next following each period when the number of votes cast for the office of secretary of state shall be ascertained, be fixed by law, and apportioned among the several counties according to the number of votes cast for all the candidates for the office of secretary of state at such last preceding general election."
"Yes" means a vote for the amendment; "No" is a vote against it.
The last proposal pertains to income tax. It is:
"Section 8—The general assembly may levy and collect a tax upon income, from whatever source derived at such rates, and in such manner as with such exemptions as may be prescribed by law."
"Yes" is a vote for the amendment; "No" is against it.
The amendment proposal ballot is a separate ballot received at the poll and each proposal is separated so persons voting may vote "yes" or "no" on any of the proposals that they wish to.

The ballot is entitled "On Proposed Amendments To The Constitution Of The State Of Indiana."
