## MINING OUTLOOK

### MUCH IMPROVED

#### Indiana Coal Miners End District Convention At Terre Haute

Terre Haute, Ind., March 18.—(United Press.)—Leaving the coal mining outlook in Indiana greatly improved, delegates to the district constitutional convention here had departed for their homes today.

The convention adjourned sine die yesterday afternoon after again selecting Terre Haute as the convention city for 1929.

The convention leaves settlement of the impending Indiana coal strike April 1 in the hands of a district scale committee in the event the central competitive scale committee fails to effect a settlement for the field, and the international policy committee approves.

Any agreement reached by the district committee with Indiana operators would be referred to a re-convened district convention for final action.

James H. Terry, who becomes vice-president of the district April 1, will replace Tyler G. Lawton, retiring president, on the international scale committee.
