The Golden Rule is urged for those who neglect to pay their bills when they promise by the business men in a page display which appeared in this paper yesterday and the message is important. Of course one of the difficult things in business these days is to finance it and to carry those who ask for credit. Frequently to do that the merchant must borrow money and the interest is often more than the profit. That's hardly fair, is it?

One of the best barometers of times for the average newspaper is foreign advertising. When efforts are being made to keep things moving, the biggest concerns are announcing their plans with advertising publicity. Building and loan associations are good only when they are operated for the community more than for private gains.

Judge Dearth appearing as a witness before the senate in his own impeachment trial, made a very poor

witness, it is announced in the press dispatches. He couldn't remember and couldn't recall, reminding one of evidence before a grand jury by some one who didn't want to remember things and by the way it is charged that the judge frequently dropped in to the grand jury room to aid in their work. Perhaps he learned the fact there that such an answer usually prevents further questioning on a disagreeable subject.

Three ministers testified yesterday in the Dearth impeachment hearing that the jurist's reputation for integrity and honesty is bad, a wallop that may convince the members of the senate of his unfitness to sit in judgment as a court. Arguments were made today and the case will go to the senate as a jury this evening. It's a disgraceful affair, first of its kind in ninety-two years and leads many to believe that Thomas Adams knew what he was talking about when he said there were a lot of things in Indiana which needed cleaning.

Superintendent Hinkle of the State Highway Commission visited us today on his inspection of roads in this part of the state. He promised his immediate effort to have the commission take over the east and west road through this city, from the state line to Huntington. We are confident that action will be taken on the new highway during the next few days. 
