

PLAN ANNUAL CORN CONTEST

Entries In Five-Acre Corn Contest Close June 15; Prizes Are Offered

The Five Acre Corn contest, which has been an annual feature among Adams county farmers for the last several years, will again be conducted in Adams county this year. Despite the lateness of the season, leading corn growers declare there is still a good possibility of producing a good crop. In many cases, earlier varieties of corn are being obtained in order to beat the frost. Others are planning to use commercial fertilizer which, it is said will hasten the maturity ten days or two weeks.

In order to encourage farmers who wish to enter the contest, the Krick-Tyndall Co. of Decatur, the Gottschalk Tile Works and the B-G construction Co., of Berne, are offering substantial premiums to be awarded winners. The managers of the three companies named have authorized the county agent to announce that the amount of premiums given will depend upon the number entering the contest. By this plan, it is expected those whose yields rank above the average of the contestants will be assured premiums, their size depending upon the number in the contest.

Requirements are that those entering the contest, become members of the Indiana Corn Growers Association by paying a fee of fifty cents before June 15. This fee will be taken at the county agents office or by any of the above mentioned firms.

Geneva, Not Rome City, Is Where Mrs. Porter Wrote "The Harvester"

In a dispatch from that city to the Fort Wayne News-Sentinel Monday, telling about Director Leo Meehan and his company of movie actors arriving at Rome City the statement is made that Mrs. Gene Stratton Porter lived at the 'Limberlost Cabin' at Rome City for eleven years and that her farm there furnished the locale for the entire book, 'The Harvester,' which is to be filmed by Mr. Meehan and his company.

"Mrs. Porter wrote 'The Harvester' right here in Geneva, at the original 'Limberlost Cabin' and until after the book was written her beautiful Rome City home, with its wild flowers and shrubs and almost perfect imitation of nature as it had been years before in the swamps of the Limberlost, had not even been created.

"The real scenes depicted in the book were laid in the vicinity of Geneva. However, there is little of the old Limberlost to recall scenes of the beautiful pictures of nature described in her books. After the real Limberlost had disappeared, Mrs. Porter removed to Sylvan Lake and there, from her knowledge of the old Limberlost, built an artificial 'Limberlost' on ground which she owned."

MUSSOLINI NAMES SELF RADIO CZAR TO DEVELOP BROADCASTING

Rome (United Press)—Broadcasting on a world basis with centrally controlled stations is the latest program of Premier Mussolini. The Duce has reserved to himself the right to appoint the president of the new central radio body, which is to bring radio here up to the level of other European countries.

A special law, authorizing the creation by the newly formed corporation, of nine new transmitting stations, has been passed. Rome is to have a 25 kilowatt transmitter, instead of the present 3.5 KW station. This will bring it up to the level of the big high-power stations of Daventry in England and Radio-Paris. It will be inferior in power only to the 30 KW Berlin station,

at present the most powerful in Europe.

The present system of charging the equivalent of \$5 a year to possessors of radio sets will be maintained, but in addition a trifling tax is to be imposed on all house-holders, whether they have sets or not.

Italy, at present, possesses only three radio-casting stations, namely Rome, Mila and Naples, the first named running on 3 KW power, while the other two work with 2.5 and 2 KW respectively.

While radio was received with great enthusiasm on its introduction into Italy some two and a half years ago, it has languished of late, though a certain impetus was given to it again by the broadcasting, during the recent


