Construction of the District Sewer on and along the following route to-wit:

Beginning in the center of the area running east and west between lots No. 439 and 454 in Nuttman Northwestern Addition to the City of Decatur, Indiana, at the north west corner, said lot No. 439 then running east in the direction of said area and approxi-

mately 235 feet and then to terminate in the Decatur Street Branch of the Marshall Street Sewer.
