YOCUM IS HELD FOR GRAND JURY

Confessed Bank Robber
Pleads Guilty To Charge;
Bond Is \$10,000

Merle Yocum, 30, who has confessed that he took part in the holdup of the National bank at Rockford, O., July 20, entered a plea of guilty when arraigned in court before Mayor J. L. Morrow, of Celina, Ohio, on a charge of bank robbery. Yocum was bound over to the Mercer county, Ohio, grand jury and his bond was fixed at \$10,000. Not being able to furnish bond, he was committed to the county jail.

Yocum was arrested in Cleveland, Ohio, last Saturday, and was brought to Celina Monday. He claims that he had five companions in the planning and execution of the holdup, but refuses to name them. A total of \$2,591.80 was taken in the holdup. Miss Mayme Martin, assistant cashier of the bank, was alone in the building when the two bandits, one of them recognized as Yocum, entered. She was bound and placed in the bank vault. During the robbery, Grant Frysinger, a Rockford citizen, entered the bank and grappled with one of the bandits. He said he recognized Yocum, the latter having been a former resident of the Rockford community.

NEW WITNESS IN POLITICAL PROBE

Stephenson's Former Private Secretary Interviewed In Pennsylvania

Indianapolis, Ind., July 29—(UP)—Told of activities of D. C. Stephenson in Indiana politics by a new witness special prosecutor Emsley W. Johnson and deputy William H. Sheaffer returned today from their mysterious trip to Washington, Pa., where they interviewed Foster Strader, Stephenson's former private secretary, Thursday.

They would not comment on the report they were about to try to get more of Stephenson's personal papers from a New York City safety deposit box.

The third grand jury to investigate the political situation was to hear state representative Russell V. Duncan of Indianapolis again today. He was questioned at length Wednesday and for a brief time Thursday about "stephensonism".

Jackson Is Returning

Macinac Island, Michigan, July 29—(UP)—Governor Ed Jackson of Indiana and his family left here today aboard the Lake Steamer Western States for Detroit enroute home, they expected to reach Indianapolis early Monday.

Governor Jackson has been here attending the annual conference of Governors of which he is the treasurer. Upon leaving the governor maintained his silence about the charge that he was the messenger for a \$10,000 bribe offer to former governor Warren McCray but intimated he would issue an important statement sometime after his return.

Jackson likewise refused comment on a rumor published in a Sault Ste. Marie newspaper Thursday that he had committed suicide. The rumor appeared while the governor was fishing at Brevoort Lake nearby.

AIMEE PLANS TO QUIT PASTORATE

Evangelist Expects To Resign As Pastor Of Angelus Temple Soon

Los Angeles, Cal., July 29—(UP)—Her resignation refused by followers of the four square gospel Aimee Semple McPherson announced today that an associate pastor will be appointed to take charge of Angelus Temple while she conducts a world wide evangelistic campaign.

"I suggested to my committee that I resign, but this was immediately and overwhelmingly vetoed, Mrs. McPherson said.

Los Angeles, Cal., July 29—(UP)—Aimee Semple McPherson, flaming haired evangelist of world wide fame, will resign as pastor of Angelus temple and leave Los Angeles, it was learned here today.

The self-styled "admiral of the four square gospel lighthouse" following a stormy session with Mrs. Minnie Kennedy, her mother, and two lawyers last night prepared her resignation today to become effective where a successor is appointed.

The controversy between mother and daughter over control of the temple, which for the past week has threatened to wreck the four square gospel on the reef of dissension, reached its climax at the conference last night.

Preceding the meeting, Mrs. Kennedy and the evangelist staged a "watermelon party" for the benefit of the press—both eating a slice of watermelon holding hands and patting each other's cheeks.

Better Fire Protection Planned At Willshire

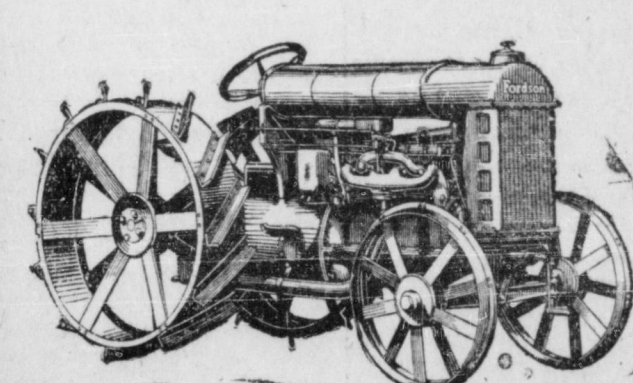
Willshire, Ohio, July 29—(Special)
