Bomb Wrecks Detroit Motion Picture Theatre

Detroit, Nov. 2.—(INS)—A tremen-

dous bomb explosion early today shat-

tered windows and shook buildings

for blocks around, and partly buried

under twisted wreckage a man who is

believed shortly afterwards in Highland

Park General hospital, and who is

believed to have been one of the

bombers. Damage was estimated at

\$285,000.

A heavy blast shook the deserted

streets of Highland Park. The roof of

the Tivoli theatre hurled skyward

in blazing pieces, the side walls split

outward, cement blocks weighing 45

pounds hurtling through the air for

nearly 200 feet, and a veritable rain

of broken glass littered the pavement
