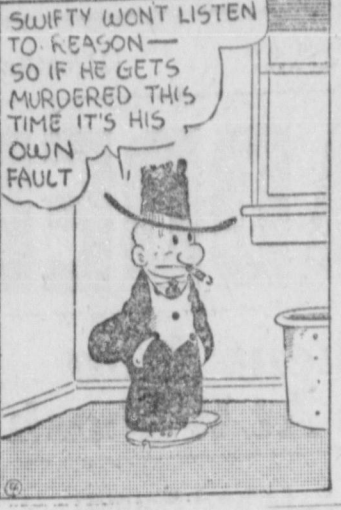

## STANDARD OIL HEAD TESTIFIES

E. G. Seubert Is Witness In Teapot Dome Investigation Today

Washington, Feb. 2.—(UP)—A contract worth \$5,000,000 was bought by oil men in the Continental Trading Company, deal for \$400,000, E. G. Seubert, president of the Standard Oil Company of Indiana, told the senate Teapot Dome committee today.

Seubert took the stand today in a continuance of the committee's investigation into disposition of the \$3,000,000 profits of the Continental Trading company, part of which, according to testimony were transferred by Harry F. Sinclair, oil man, to Former Secretary of Interior Fall soon after the Teapot Dome lease transaction.

Seubert said that after the Continental had made \$3,000,000 profit from the contract under which it was to buy 50,000,000 barrels of Mexico oil, it sold the contract to the Sinclair Crude Oil Purchasing company and the Prairie Oil & Gas company.

The remainder of the contract was worth \$5,000,000 but the deal was made for \$400,000.

"I don't know why it was done," Seubert said. "I didn't have anything to do with the deal."
