STANDARD OIL
HEAD TESTIFIESE. G. Seubert Is Witness In
Teapot Dome Investi-
gation Today

Washington, Feb. 2.—(UP)—A con-
tract worth \$5,000,000 was bought by
oil men in the Continental Trading
Company, deal for \$400,000, E. G.
Seubert, president of the Standard
Oil Company of Indiana, to the
Teapot Dome committee today.

Seubert took the stand today in a
continuation of the committee's in-
vestigation into disposition of the
\$3,000,000 profits of the Continental
Trading company, part of which, ac-
cording to testimony were trans-
ferred by Harry F. Sinclair, oil man, to
Former Secretary of Interior Fall
soon after the Teapot Dome lease
transaction.

Seubert said that after the Conti-
nental had made \$3,000,000 profit
from the contract under which it was
to buy 50,000,000 barrels of Mexia
oil, it sold the contract to the Sinclair
Oil Co., the Prairie Oil & Gas company.
The remainder of the contract was
worth \$5,000,000 but the deal was
made for \$400,000.

"I don't know why it was done,"
Seubert said. "I didn't have anything
to do with the deal."
