## HOOVER FAVORS 18TH AMENDMENT

## Presidential Candidate Goes On Record As Opposed To Repeal

Washington, Feb. 23.—(U.P.)—Secretary of Commerce Hoover, candidate for the Republican presidential nomination, informed Senator Borah today he does not favor repeal of the 18th amendment. The answer was made in reply to Borah's "dry questionnaire" sent to Hoover and other presidential candidates.

"Upon my return to Washington, I have taken up your letter," Hoover wrote. "I feel that the discussion of public questions by reply to questionnaires is likely to be unsatisfactory and oftentimes leads to confusion rather than clarity."

"Replies to the scores of such inquiries on many questions are impossible. Out of my regard for your known sincerity and your interest in the essential question, I will, however say again that I do not favor the repeal of the eighteenth amendment."
