Florida Tuesday and told the 'order takers' in a prepared statement which was widely published that he had appointed Frank Dailey for governor.

"He came back, according to an Indianapolis newspaper, tanned with the sunshine of Florida.

"On May 8, I predict, he will be tanned by the independent Democratic voters of Indiana. Indiana Democrats have outgrown the present fiction that their votes may be controlled by the dictum of a one-trick political boss who fondly believes his ultimatum expressed to Democrats should have all the binding force and the supreme court decision.
