## CATHOLICS PLAN EASTER SERVICES

### Services Commemorating Christ's Resurrection Arranged For Sunday

Emerging from the sorrow of Good Friday, and the state of mourning, which the church and the faithful observed yesterday, commemorating the Passion and death of Jesus on the Cross, the St. Mary's Catholic church will gloriously celebrate the joyful feast of Easter, celebrating Christ's resurrection from the tomb, at all services tomorrow.

"Christ, the Lord has risen" and the joy accompanying the fulfillment of His prophecies will be fittingly celebrated in the masses Sunday. The Easter high mass will be held at 5 o'clock. It will be a solemn high mass with the Rev. Joseph A. Hession, acting pastor, celebrant; the Rev. Father William Collins, deacon; the Rev. Father John Feithaus, sub-deacon.

Holy Communion will be distributed during this mass. The second mass will be at 9:45 o'clock. It will be a high mass with sermon. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will be held following this mass.

Replacing the tomb under the side altar, in which lies an statue of the risen Christ, signifying that He has risen. Yesterday at the Good Friday services and during the Three Hours hundreds of the faithful knelt before the cross of Jesus, meditated on the passion and death of Jesus and prayed. The Three Hours were attended by approximately 1000 people yesterday.
