



Dramatic Story Of Business Rivalry Lies Back Of German Flight

Berlin, April 12. (INS) — Behind the daring flight of Captain Koehl and his two companions lies a dramatic story of keen rivalry for future trans-Atlantic air traffic between the two foremost aviation organizations in Germany, it was learned today.

On one side there is the Lufthansa Commercial Flying Company, which operates an extensive network of airlines all over Germany and is subsidized by the German government. On the other, there is the Junkers Aircraft Manufacturing Company, which manufactures most of Germany's airplanes.

Captain Koehl's attempt today to blaze a westward trail across the Atlantic by air, it was authoritatively learned, is backed by the Junkers and the German shipping interests, particularly the North German Lloyd.

Indicted For Robbery
