**Van Nuys Chosen Judge
For Klan Ouster Suit**

Indianapolis, April 19.—(U.P.)—Fredrick Van Nuys, Indianapolis attorney will serve as special judge in attorney general Arthur L. Gilliam's suit to oust the Ku Klux Klan from Indiana. Circuit judge Harry O. Chamberlin said today.

Van Nuys was agreed on by Attorneys for Gilliam and for the Klan, and his name submitted to judge Chamberlin. Date for the trial will be announced soon.

**Move To Halt Spread Of
Rabies In Marion County**

Indianapolis, April 19.—(U.P.)—Marion county and Indianapolis health authorities will be called into a conference today by Dr. W. F. King, State Health board secretary to plan methods of preventing the spread of rabies here. This action comes as a result of the recommendation made by the health board at its meeting Wednesday that such a step be taken.

Attention of the board was called to the rabies situation as the result of the biting of seven persons Friday by a dog whose brain after a laboratory inspection revealed it was suffering from rabies.
