ROBINSON, STUMP WIN NOMINATION FOR U. S. SENATOR

(CONTINUED FROM PAGE ONE)

ing the victory of United States Senator James E. Watson, over Secretary of Commerce Herbert Hoover, in presidential primary yesterday, Oscar Indiana's Republican "presidential" G. Foellinger, Hoover's state manager, this afternoon declared that, in view of Hoover's large popular vote in Indiana, it was Senator Watson's "moral duty to permit Indiana's 33 delegates to the national convention to go to Hoover after Watson was eliminated from the consideration."

Watson Has 25,000 Lead Indianapolis, May 9—Returns from 2,720 out of the 3,610 precincts in the state gave for president; Republican James E. Watson, 155,837; Herbert Hoover, 130,605. Democrat, Evans Woolen 89,919.

For senator Robinson, Republican had 149,377 votes and Stump, Democrat, had 93,964 votes.

Watson's Lead Grows Indianapolis—(INS)—United States Senator James E. Watson was steadily increasing his lead over Herbert Hoover for Indiana, 33 votes for President as returns from yesterday's primary continued to be compiled here this afternoon.

Unofficial returns from 2,320 of the states 3,610 precincts gave Watson 155,790 votes and Hoover 121,688. Although the headquarters staff of Hoover still clung to the hope that returns not yet in would cut down the Senators lead supporters of the secretary of commerce already were pointing with pride to what they term Hoover's wonderful showing against the entire field of Republican aspirants.

Robinson and Stump Strong Indianapolis Ind.—(INS)—Unofficial returns from 1,680 of the state's 3,610 precincts gave the following votes in the contest for the Republican senatorial nomination: U. S. Senator Arthur R. Robinson, 91,101; Attorney General Arthur L. Gilliom 43,628; Former Judge Solon J. Carter 25,394.

At the same hour, 1,100 precincts gave the following returns in the contest for the Democratic senatorial nomination: Albert Stump, 45,661; Walter Myers 22,149; L. William Curry 7,555.

Dailey Has Big Lead Indianapolis—(INS)—Unofficial returns early today from 1,525 precincts of the state gave the following votes in the ten-angled race for the Republican nomination for governor; Schortemeier 40,296; Landis 35,013; Adams 29,780; Leslie 23,541; Eschback 16,977; Jewett 16,838; Douglas 6,012; Lesh 5,440; Rucker 3,362; Ewry 1,375. Unofficial returns from 1,372 precincts gave the following votes in the Democratic gubernatorial race: Dailey 45,734; Frederick 27,113; Crawford 9,790; Dale 7,098; Wells 4,746; Hershman 3,768; Holt 2,288.
