Coroner F. C. Krest who examined the body declared that the little victim had been criminally attacked, and death was due to strangulation.

As police began the hunt for the murderer, detective headquarters communicated with Youngstown, where a two week's search for ten-year-old Beatrice Rosenbaum ended Sunday with the finding of her body in a wooded ravine.

The Youngstown girl had been enticed from her home, according to police, and taken away in an auto which was also described as "a small dark sedan."

cago, where the number of cattle arriving daily is less than half that of a year ago. It seems to be the old problem of supply and demand and the only hopeful sign is the fact that pork continues normal and the housewife can gain an advantage by using that meat to a larger extent. Two-year-old cattle are now bringing from \$100 to \$125 on foot, it is said, and the farmer who has a herd ready for market is able to derive a good profit.

As a result of the increase in meats, hotels and eating houses over the country, especially in the larger cities, are raising prices to meet the situation. Local dealers declare they will do everything they can to accommodate their patrons and at the same time furnish them with the particular cuts of beef they desire.

Polar experts, working in conjunction with weather experts, have spent most of their time since the Italia's disappearance deducing her probable route and point of descent.

Prepare Searching Expeditions
Oslo, Norway, May 29.—(U.P.)—Three nations joined today in preparing expeditions to search for the long overdue Polar airship, Italia.

By land, sea and air these expeditions will scan the waste lands of the far north in an attempt to find General Umberto Nobile, his 15 aides and the study craft.

The steamer Braganza, chartered by Nobile's agents to go to search for the lost craft, left Tromsø this morning for Kings Bay.

Fliers and ships will be sent from Norway. Airplane expeditions will be ordered by Italy while Russia is prepared to cooperate to the fullest extent.

The steamer Hobby of the Norwegian government was at Tromsø, under steam, prepared to leave as soon as relief fliers arrive. The government will send a cutter to aid the Citta Di Milano, now north of Spitzbergen, if necessary.
