Wheatley and his wife have entered pleas of not guilty to the charge of robbing the Linn Grove bank. It is probable that they will be turned over to Federal authorities next week to be arraigned on a federal charge in connection with the theft of an automobile used in bank robberies.

When arraigned in court earlier this week, Makley asked for more time in which to enter a plea to the charge of robbery, saying that he wanted to help his sister-in-law out of trouble. After learning that the charge against her was to be dismissed, he expressed a willingness to plead guilty to the charge today. After being sentenced, the court asked him if he wished to make any statement, and he replied in the negative.

Smith still has the foremost number of delegates and his friends continue to predict his nomination on an early ballot, especially since the platform framers are reported ready to put in a forceful "law enforcement" plank in the platform.

Smith To Remain Silent

Albany, N. Y., June 23—(INS)—Governor Al Smith will not recommend any plank on the subject of prohibition to the Democratic national convention at Houston, he said today after arriving from New York, where he conferred with party leaders before they left for the convention to push his candidacy for the Democratic presidential nomination.

"All I have to say on prohibition I said Thursday," the governor continued.

The executive will remain silent until the convention has acted, his associates said, and he will make no

public utterances on any of the party issues until after that issue has been settled by the convention.

The governor's friends are claiming that the reiteration of his previous stand on prohibition has strengthened his candidacy. They point to the large number of congratulatory messages the executive has received on his New York statement. In that declaration he said he had not changed his views in opposition to Vol-

steadism.

Horse, Frightened By Thunder, Injures Man

Bluffton, Ind., June 23.—(INS)—Lightning, long looked upon as dang-

erous, gave way to thunder in causing a casualty during the recent electrical storm, here.
