Coroner Returns A
Verdict Of Suicide

Kendallville, Ind., July 3—(INS)—A verdict of suicide due to a self-inflicted gun shot wound in the head was the verdict of coroner Harold Shaw following his inquest into the tragic death here of John Marion Ishell, 45, wealthy mortgage and finance broker of Chicago.

Ishell shot himself in the head with a 22 caliber rifle at the country home of J. F. Faux, three miles west of here yesterday. Mrs. Faux found the body.

The wounded man was rushed to Lake View hospital here where he died last night without regaining consciousness.
