Former Bluffton Woman Attempts Suicide In West

Bluffton, July 20.—A message received here today said that Mrs. Addie Powell, formerly of this city, who drank poison last Sunday night at Sandpoint, Idaho, in a suicidal attempt, is improving and is expected to recover.

She is reported to have attempted suicide after her husband, Vic Powell, former Fort Wayne traffic officer, deserted her at Sandpoint, driving away in their new automobile, purchased just before they left for the west on May 3.

The automobile was found abandoned at Spokane, but no trace of Powell was found.

It had been reported in dispatches from Idaho that Mrs. Powell had said that her husband wrote a check for \$1,000 on her account on a Bluffton bank. No such check has appeared at the local bank and inquiry here disclosed that a request had been received here for an advancement to the Powells and that because the estate of the late Herschel Davis, former husband of Mrs. Powell, has not been adjusted, there was no money for an advancement. It was following the forwarding of such word that it was learned here that Powell had disappeared.

HOOVER RETURNS TO HOME STATE

Aboard Hoover Train, Sacramento, Calif., July 20.—Herbert Hoover, the first Californian ever nominated for the presidency, returned to his home state today on a mission of sorrow and with all "welcome home" festivities postponed until after the funeral of his father-in-law Charles D. Henry.

The Henry obsequies will be held at 2 o'clock this afternoon in the chapel of the Leland Stanford university, which both Mr. and Mrs. Hoover attended years ago.

The Hoover train swinging down out of the Sierra Nevadas early this morning past the famous California orchard country was running far ahead of its original schedule in order to get the republican nominee and his wife to their Palo Alto home in time to attend the funeral.

Receptions Ordered Abandoned
All receptions were ordered abandoned including a great welcome home celebration in San Francisco. His train was routed from Oakland via the Dumbarton bridge direct to Palo Alto where it was due at 9:45 this morning, thus avoiding a ferry boat ride across San Francisco Bay and all stops in that city.

Indianapolis, Ind., July 20.—(INS)—With a \$1,000 reward offered for the arrest of the slayers of Motor Policeman Paul Miller, 33, the hunt for the two men who shot and fatally wounded the officer was renewed with vigor here today.

Miller died at the City hospital late Wednesday after he whispered the wish that his assailants be caught before

they shot someone else.

He was the 13th Indianapolis police officer to die in line of duty since 1890. On May 7, last, Patrolman Charles E. Carter, negro, was slain by an unidentified man.

Miller underwent a blood transfusion a few hours before his death.
