STATE TAX BOARD INCREASES VALUE HERE \$1,174,860

known. All the members of the board could not be seen this morning, but from expressions made during the session, it is doubtful if the board will make the changes, without a mandate from the state board.

The assessed valuation of real estate, farm lands and improvements in Adams county, as made by the township assessors and the adjustments made by the county board of review, total \$28,931,710. The increases, ordered would bring the assessments above \$30,000,000, or a little above the 1927 assessments. The above figure does not include the state's assessments for railroads and utilities.

Increases Made Elsewhere

Indianapolis, August 2.—(U.P.)—Modification on taxes in several Indiana counties was made in orders sent out today by the state tax board. These include:

Elkhart County: A ten per cent reduction on all improvements in the city of Elkhart. A ten per cent increase on all improvements in Goshen.

Dekalb County: A ten per cent increase on all lots and improvements thereon in the city of Auburn.

Clay County: A twelve and one-half per cent increase on all improvements in Brazil.

Boone County: A ten per cent increase on all merchandise in the county outside of incorporated towns and cities.

Wells County: A ten per cent increase in lands in Jefferson township.

Noble County: A ten per cent increase on all merchandise in the county except in Ligonier; a twenty per cent increase on household goods in

Kendallville; a ten per cent increase on household goods in Ligonier; a twenty per cent increase on personal property except items listed on page one of the schedule in Perry township; A ten per cent increase on all personal property except items listed on page one in Swan township, schedule.

Knox County: An eleven and one ninth per cent increase on lands in Vincennes township outside of Vincennes City, and an increase of ten per cent on lands in Harrison township.

Lake County: A twenty-five per cent increase on all lands and improvements in North township; a thirty per cent increase on all lots in Hobart city; and a 40 per cent increase on lots and improvements in the city of New Chicago.

Montgomery County: An increase of 10 per cent on lands in Coal Creek township outside of cities and towns.

Posey County: A ten per cent increase on lands and lots in the entire county.

Putnam County: A five per cent increase on all lands and lots in the entire county.

LaPorte County: A fifty per cent increase on all lots and improvements in the cities of LaPorte and Michigan City.
