Emerald Popular As Summer Jewel

The emerald has once more come into its own, judging from an exposition of the precious green stone now going on in Paris. It is set in all manner of ways, in brooches, necklaces, pendants, rings, watches, cuff-links etc., every piece an individual art creation with no hint at modern standardization. It is considered the stone par excellence to be combined with diamonds, according to the Parisian jewellers who prophesy great popularity for it this coming winter. In the very center of this modern collection is the famous emerald given by Napoleon to Josephine de Beauharnais in 1809, a magnificent stone of great purity.

Contrasts in the different lustres of metals are used with clever effect in the latest modernistic bracelets and necklaces. Platinum, silver, white gold, and bright are used in side and forming a heavy, flat cord.

Various shaped plaques set side by side. Sports jewelry is new and smart and is largely being furnished by the dressmakers who furnish the sports clothes to wear with it. Lucien Leong shows a charming necklace and bracelet of flat rings in gold colored metal.

Flat enamel cuff-links for wear with the tailored chemise blouse come in all colors and interesting designs. There are some in opaque crystal with a tiny rhinestone in the center which are very smart for the georgette blouse if it has cuffs.

The new shoe buckles include very attractive designs in crystal combined with rhinestones. One shop is showing them in square shape, very clear and white. Little curving bands of rhinestones in tiny floral designs which fit around the edges of the satin slipper are also very smart.


