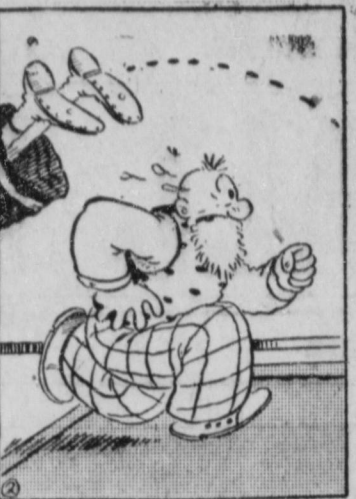

TO CHANGE ROUTE

OF ROAD NO. 27

A new route for Federal highway No. 27, between Berne and Geneva has been chosen by the state highway commission, according to word received from the commission. The new route will parallel the Pennsylvania railroad tracks, it is said. The pavement which is being laid on the road between Monroe and Berne this summer, will be extended into the town of Berne, it was learned yesterday. It had been planned to pave the road to a point about a mile north of Berne. Stakes for the remainder of the road into Berne were to be set today and the survey of the right of way will begin at once.

Senator T. A. Gottschalk, of Berne, is said to have been instrumental in getting the highway commission to Berne this summer. E. M. Ray, of Berne, a member of the Adams County Better Roads Committee, also aided in the matter.

According to information available here, the federal highway will turn to the left where it strikes Berne's main street from the north, instead of to the right, as has been in the past. The road will be routed over Berne's main street as far east as the road running south from near the center of the town, and then south to Geneva. A large levee will be built along the Wabash river. The road between Berne and Geneva will not be constructed this year, however. The new route, eliminates several bad curves.

The stretch of road between Monroe and Berne is nearly ready for the asphalt top.
