ordered the county board of review to place a 30 per cent increase on improvements in Berne.

The county board of review refused to comply with the recommendations and rejected the entire order. The increased first ordered would have increased the valuations in this county approximately \$1,100,000. The net valuations in the county, after deducting mortgage exemptions, totaled \$32,911,210. With the increases ordered today the valuations will be increased \$690,048, making a total of \$33,601,258. The valuation last year was \$35,902,770.

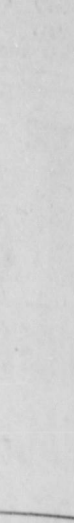

HOOVER STARTS STUMPING TOUR

Aboard Hoover Special Train Nearing Santa Barbara, Aug. 17.—(UP)—Herbert Hoover started campaigning today with a vengeance.

Out on the stump for the first time since he received the Republican presidential nomination and really for the first time in his life, Hoover came to southern California for an important prepared speech and a hurry-up visit to six cities.

Never before has Hoover been a candidate for public office, so he looked forward with considerable interest to his first day out.

The candidate will be in Santa Barbara for a tour of the missions; Glendale for a ten minute reception; Los Angeles, for a speech on the much-discussed Boulder Dam issue; Long Beach for the Pacific southwest exposition and the Iowa Society picnic; Pasadena for a brief talk at the station and San Bernardino for a ten minute station reception.

Tonight he turns east for active campaigning in Arizona, New Mexico, Kansas and Iowa before returning to his home in Washington.

BANK CASHIER DROWNS SELF

Goshen, Ind., Aug. 17.—(INS)—State bank examiners were expected to arrive at Millersburg, near here, today, to make an audit of the Millersburg State Bank following the suicide late yesterday afternoon of Harry A. Beck, 38, cashier of the bank.

The bank was not opened this morning. Its officials stated that they were confident that there was no shortage but decided upon the closing to make a complete investigation.

Beck's suicide was attributed to the statements made by Roy A. Sample, 40, arrested yesterday at Noblesville, Ind., on a charge of obtaining \$2,000 from the Millersburg bank under false pretenses.

When Sample was returned to Goshen he said that the money had been loaned to him to finance rum running expeditions and that it was lost when he was arrested and fined heavily in Michigan. The loan had been made against the order of the directors and had been kept secret

from them until several days ago it was learned.
