

ONE HOOSIER IN 10 GETS LICENSE TO HUNT OR FISH

Approximately 300,000 Fishing And Hunting Licenses Issued This Year

Indianapolis, Ind., Aug. 30.—(Special)—Approximately 300,000 resident fishing and hunting licenses will be issued during the fiscal year ending September 30, which means virtually one license issued for every ten of Indiana's approximate 3,000,000 inhabitants.

"It is the biggest license sale ever put on in Indiana, and a fifty thousand increase over 1927," declared George N. Mainfield, superintendent of the fish and game division of the state conservation department, whose office distributes them.

Mainfield optimistically believes the figures will even go higher and considering that licenses sell for \$1 each, points out that not another state in the Union sells so many resident licenses considering population.

It is further remarkable in that under the Indiana fish and game laws, landowners, their children, tenants and children of tenants, do not have to take out a license to hunt on land owned or controlled by them, nor to fish in public waters on their lands. Also that no exserviceman who is a resident of the state, has to purchase a license, but instead enjoys a free permit.

Conservation department officials point to three contributing factors largely responsible for this remarkable license sale. First, there is a constant increase of people enjoying the sport as good roads extend over the state and automobiles come into so generous use. Second, there are literally thousands of people who take out a license and use it but one time. They contribute because they know that money thus spent is used for bettering fishing and hunting conditions in the state, and to purchase lands to create a public estate for Indiana. In the last few years the fish and game division—which division by the way receives no legislative appropriation—used its surplus earnings in adding two fish hatcheries and purchasing 12,000 acres of forest lands. This property now belongs to the state and its use for the common enjoyment of all assured. Last but also an effective reason for license sales is strict enforcement of the laws. This is accomplished through a warren of violators being punished under laws applicable to each case.

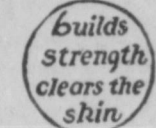
