# OLD HOME WEEK

*Open house will be held at the municipal plant during Old Home Week and we extend an invitation to all to visit the plant.*

Built in 1897, during the administration of Hon. Bart Quinn, our city plant has been improved, rebuilt and kept up with city progress, giving the city an electric plant with 6,000 H.P. capacity or 40,000 KWH. Originally built at a cost of \$15,000, with a capacity of 100 H.P. or 2,000 KWH., the municipal plant now represents an investment of approximately \$750,000. The 600 ornamental lights are maintained by the city plant.

Besides furnishing all the electric current and power for the residences, business houses, street lights and manufacturers, the municipal plant pumps and distributes water throughout the city. This department has extended its water mains throughout the city, installed extra fire hydrants and increased its capacity from 1,500,000 gallons to 2,656,000 every 24 hours. For fire protection and reserve the water department carries 350,000 in its reservoirs.
