

NINE HURT IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Four Are Seriously Injured
In Collision Of Two Cars
At Indianapolis

Indianapolis, Sept. 19.—(U.P.)—Nine persons were injured, four of them seriously, here early today when an automobile driven by Alvy Brooks, Detroit, crashed into a machine driven by Willard James, 22, of near here, and overturned.

Seven of the injured were occupants of a large Studebaker touring car which Brooks was driving. All occupants of the Studebaker were residents of Detroit and River Rouge, Detroit suburb. Brooks was the only occupant of the car uninjured.

George H. Brooks, 35, his brother, and Mrs. George Brooks, 30, were among the seriously injured. Brooks' hips were badly crushed and was unconscious when taken to a hospital. His son Gene 4, also was unconscious as was his mother Mrs. Mary Brooks, 55, whose hips and back were badly crushed. Another son James 6, was cut and bruised. Verne Ellington, 15, a relative, sustained cuts on the head and Floyd Kenney, 21, Ellsmore, Mo., was cut and bruised.

The Brooks automobile after crashing into the car driven by James hurdled a ditch and overturned in a field. James and his wife were but slightly hurt.

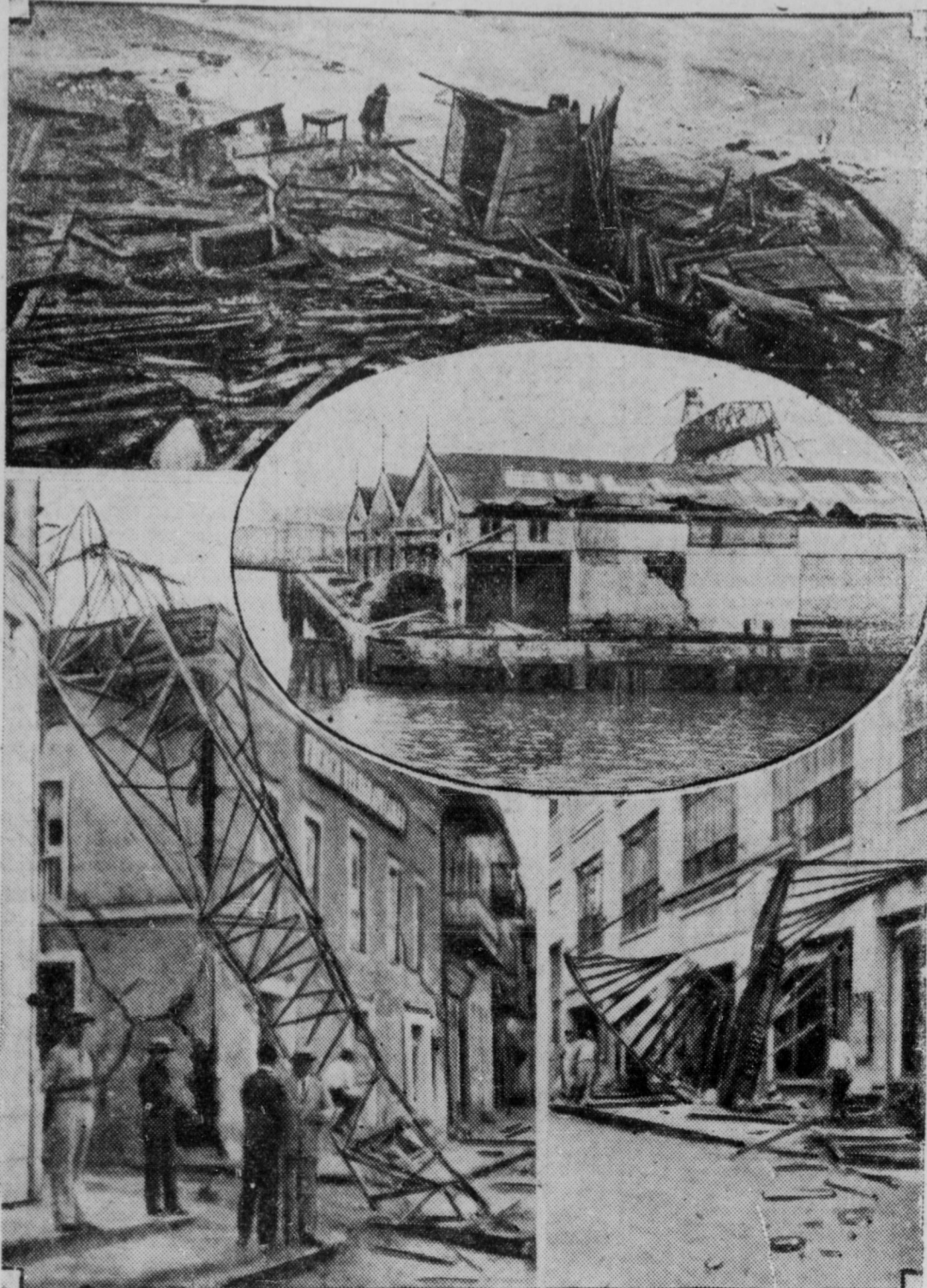
