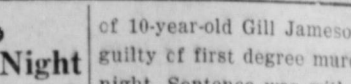
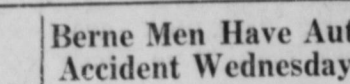
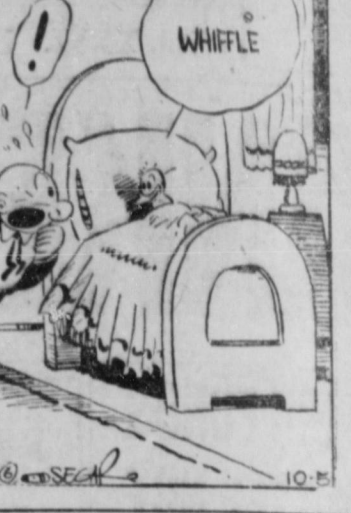

The jury deliberated only one hour and forty-five minutes before returning their verdict against the young Japanese student.
