SENATOR MOSES IS UNDER FIRE

Washington, Nov. 1.—(U.P.)—Senator George H. Moses of New Hampshire, eastern Republican director, was charged directly today by Chairman Raskob of the Democratic national committee with instructing circulation in North Carolina of "one of the most vicious and anti-Catholic articles that has ever been penned for publication."

In letters to Herbert Hoover and Chairman Work of the Republican national committee, Raskob enclosed the photostatic copy of a letter he said Moses had written directing circulation of such material, and three affidavits charging Republican officials with having circulated anti-Catholic propaganda in Kansas, Mississippi and Kentucky.

WARRANT ISSUED FOR ASA KEYES

Los Angeles, Nov. 1.—(U.P.)—Asa Keyes, district attorney of Los Angeles county, may surrender today on a warrant charging him with willful corruption and misconduct in office in connection with the \$100,000,000 Julian Petroleum case.

The warrant was issued on a formal accusation of the grand jury in which it was claimed the famous prosecutor of movie scandals conspired to free persons charged with criminal offenses.

Most of the counts in the 16 page document, outlining the jury findings, referred to Keyes' conduct during the trials of defendants accused of conspiring to wreck the Julian Petroleum corporation.

effort to consummate his prohibition plans.

Herbert Hoover, Smith said, apparently was unable to speak for himself and is compelled to rely on Hughes. Smith asked Hughes why he had not taken the Republican presidential nomination rather than act the "official spokesman" for Hoover and he invited Hughes to put the same questions to the Republican nominee that he had asked him. Bringing up the war wheat question again, Smith directly challenged Hoover to deny in his St. Louis speech Friday night that he had cabled from Europe during the war that he was holding down farm prices.

Governor Smith, on his way here, rode ten miles through one of the most spectacular demonstrations he has had. Along the line of his route, thousands packed the streets and fireworks, noise making devices and chimes lit the night and shook the air.
