Hoover To Make Short Speeches In Indiana

Indianapolis, Nov. 2. (UPI)—Herbert Hoover, republican presidential nominee, will make several rear platform addresses in southern Indiana today while enroute to his home in California.

The presidential nominee, according to present plans, will make brief talks in North Vernon, Seymour, Mitchell, Washington and Vincennes.

The Hoover train will make its first Indiana stop at North Vernon where the nominee is scheduled to speak five minutes. Two minutes will be spent in Seymour, two in Mitchell, five in Washington, and five in Vincennes, according to republican headquarters here.
