Invite President To Speak At Celebration

Indianapolis, Nov. 15—U.P.—President Coolidge will be asked to speak and midwestern states to participate in Indiana's sesquicentennial celebration of George Rogers Clark's capture of Fort Sackville to be held at Vincennes, Feb. 25, 1929. This decision was reached at a dinner of the George Rogers Clark memorial committee and out of state delegates here. The Coolidge invitation was drafted. The committee recommended that three persons from each state of old northwest territory and from Kentucky, Virginia and Tennessee be appointed to ask their respective legislatures for any assistance they might be able to give. The memorial and celebration is to be financed by \$1,000,000 from congress, \$400,000 from the state and \$150,000 from Vincennes. A memorial bridge is included in the plans to mark the suit of Fort Sackville.

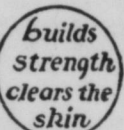

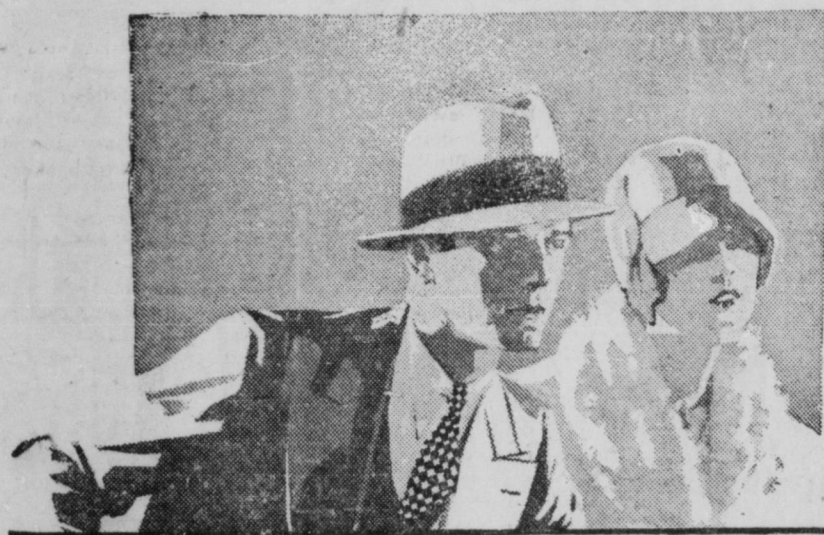
