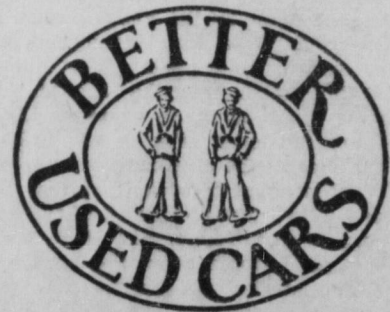
FACES MURDER CHARGE
