DISASTERS AT SEA ADD TOLL AS LIST GROWS

of ships sent out calls for help. Denmark, Germany, the Netherlands, and France were all badly hit. The barometer was at 28.25 at Copenhagen last night—the lowest since 1907—and it continued to fall.

The Admiral Ponty, 6,000 ton ship, sent out distress signals, which were answered by the Aquitania and the Maorie. There was a crew of 90 and several passengers on the Admiral Ponty. They reported leaking and that the forward hold was filling. The Maorie reported that she had reached the ship and was aiding her and the Admiral Ponty which cleared Harve Saturday.

The Yugoslav steamship Oligatop was reported in distress and the German sailing ship Pommern, 2,376 ton merchant marine training vessel was abandoned and her entire crew of 84 were rescued by the tug Heros.

Typhoon Strikes Manila

Manila, Nov. 26.—(U.P.)—The most severe typhoon experienced in the Philippine Islands in years swept southern Luzon Island today. At times the gale reached a velocity of 70 miles an hour. Damage from the storm was estimated at millions of dollars.

Thirty per cent of the coconut crop was reported destroyed. Tia-ha province suffered severe loss when wharfs and other property were damaged.

Illegaspi, port town, was flooded and government buildings were damaged. Several small ships were wrecked at various points along the coast. The cruiser Milwaukee took relief supplies to stricken districts.

Telegraph lines were severed and radio reports of the destruction wrought by the typhoon were fragmentary.

Steamer Sinks

Alberies, Algeria, Nov. 26.—(U.P.)—The coasting steamer Gesaree sank

with a loss of 14 lives during the week-end gale on the Mediterranean.

The steamer went down 1,000 yards off the coast opposite Cape Caxine, near here. Fishermen worked all night but could save only four of the crew of 18. They were unable to get close to the vessel in the mountainous waves.
