Trust company from \$25,000 to \$100,000.

The two transactions were completed at the same meeting. The Lincoln National Bank and Trust company interests were represented in the purchase transaction by Charles H. Buesching, president of the Fort Wayne institution.

No Changes in Officers

There will be no changes in the officers and directors of the Union Savings and Trust company, but Samuel M. Foster, chairman of the board of directors of the Lincoln National Bank and Trust company; William Griffin, president of the Wayne Pump company, and Charles H. Buesching, president of the Lincoln National Bank and Trust company, will be added to the board of directors of the Union Savings and Trust company.

Mr. Waugh said the bank followed the depletion of the cash resources by steady withdrawals, the money being used to purchase bonds in which the purchasers had great faith." Mr. Waugh said in a statement for his board of directors.

"The bank could not force collections on loans fast enough to meet this condition. The directors decided that the bank should be closed before the deposits were seriously depleted."

Mr. Waugh said it was the hope of the directors that the bank would be able to pay close to 100 cents on the dollar to depositors.

Chartered in 1888

The Wells County bank was chartered in 1888. It is capitalized at \$100,000. Its surplus is given as \$60,000 and its deposits at \$1,250,000.

The officers of the banks are E. B. Williamson, president; R. S. Morrow, vice-president; F. C. Waugh, vice-president, and R. N. Fitzpatrick, cashier.

The officers with David Meyer, John H. Painter, Frank Engeler, Samuel Hitchcock and John E. Sturges compose the board of directors.

Representatives of the bank were in Fort Wayne Tuesday, in an effort to secure financial aid which would make the continuation of the operation of the bank possible, but they were unsuccessful.

The exact condition of the bank will be determined by an audit.

Trust Company Sold

Fort Wayne, Feb. 13.—The Lincoln National Bank and Trust company interests of Fort Wayne yesterday completed negotiations for the purchase of the controlling interest of the capital stock of the Union Savings and Trust company of Bluffton, the only banking institution remaining in that city following the closing of the Wells County bank.

At a special meeting of the board of directors of the Union Savings and Trust company of Bluffton yesterday they voted to increase the capital stock of the Savings and

Trust company.
